Treatment: I stocked 41 large triploid grass carp (No charge).

Recommendations: Keep a lookout for gators.

Lake 6: Rated: 6

• Moderate to heavy live and dying spikerush.



<u>Treatment</u>: I stocked 7 large triploid grass carp to control the spikerush (no charge). <u>Recommendations</u>: Keep a lookout for gators.

Lake Y-2: Rated: 6

• Heavy microcystin (cyanobacteria) outbreak, looks like green paint in the north cove of the lake.



<u>Treatment</u>: I plan to apply alum (flocculant)next Monday to bind to the excess phosphorous in the lake. This alum treatment is the most effective control method for cyanobacteria (also called Blue-green algae). See attached letter that explains more about cyanobacteria growth and treatment.

Recommendations: Keep a lookout for gators.

Lake L: Rated: 9

• Minor microcystin (cyanobacteria) outbreak, looks like green paint in the north cove of the lake. This cyanobacterium is in many of the ponds that are adjacent to the golf course.



Treatment: None.
