Comments: Today I continued working on the barriers. I observed gators in Y-2 and L they need to be removed. Observed a dead deer in Y-2 with its neck bit open. I imagine it is due to the gator. I removed the deer from the lake and landscapers buried it.

Lake Y-2: Rated: 9

- Large dead deer floating in the lake.
- Minor shoreline grasses.
- One gator observed.



Treatment: I backpacked some of the shoreline weeds.

<u>Recommendations</u>: Have the gator removed as he is eating the grass carp that are controlling the weeds. This lake has a very high aquatic weed growth rate since it is very shallow.

Lake L: Rated: 10

- Lake is in great shape, as grass carp are doing their job.
- One gator observed.



<u>Treatment</u>: None needed. <u>Recommendations</u>: Have gator removed.

Lake ER-1: Rated: 7

- Spotty shoreline grasses.
- Spotty bacopa (submerged vegetation) in the shallows.





<u>**Treatment:</u>** I treated the grasses by backpack and removed trash from the lake. I also reinstalled the skimmer that I had to remove to install the fish barrier. <u>**Recommendations:**</u> Keep an eye out for gators.</u>
