#### Lake E: Rated: 7

- Moderate algae.
- Minor floating dying naiad from previous treatment.
- Moderate floating algae around perimeter.



**Treatment:** I launched the airboat and treated the algae around the perimeter. I also hand raked the heaviest algae and naiad from the northeast cove.

**<u>Recommendations</u>**: I plan to stock more grass carp this Fall.

#### Lake SV3: Rated: 4

- Heavy floating clover around perimeter.
- Heavy floating algae from dying floating clover that is feeding algae as it dies.




**<u>Treatment</u>**: I treated most of the live floating clover as best I could by backpack. I plan to treat algae next time.

**<u>Recommendations</u>**: Provide boat access, this lake would be far more controllable if treated by boat.

#### Lake SV2C: Rated: 6

- Patches of topped out bacopa along the shoreline.
- Minor torpedo grass is dying from last treatment.



<u>**Treatment:**</u> I launched the airboat and treated the bacopa. <u>**Recommendations:**</u> I plan to stock more grass carp.

### Lake V-2: Rated: 6

- Very heavy regrowth of chara, macrophytic algae (looks like submersed aquatic plant).
- Spotty spikerush around perimeter.
- Spotty torpedo grass is dying from the last treatment.



**Treatment:** I launched the airboat and treated the chara and spikerush. The growth rate of the chara in this lake is extreme, it is like no other lake in Palencia. I assume there is a nutrient source I am unaware of (may be from water being pumped in on east side where the chara regrows the fastest and is the heaviest).

**<u>Recommendations</u>**: I plan to stock more grass carp this Fall.
