The following is a summary of the discussions and actions taken at the October 16, 2019 Marshall Creek Board of Supervisors meeting.

FIRST ORDER OF BUSINESS Roll Call

 Dr. Entman called the meeting to order and the Board and Staff identified themselves for the record.

SECOND ORDER OF BUSINESS Audience Comments

There being none, the next order of business followed.

THIRD ORDER OF BUSINESS

Approval of Minutes of the September 18, 2019 Meeting

On MOTION by Mr. Hoffman seconded by Mr. Raybuck, with all in favor, the minutes of the September 18, 2019 meeting were approved.

A. Discussion of Open Items

There being none, the next order of business followed.

FOURTH ORDER OF BUSINESS

Engineer's Report

There being no report, the next order of business followed.

FIFTH ORDER OF BUSINESS

General Manager's Operations Report

- Ms. Hollis reported:
 - O They are moving into landscape project season with the cooler weather.
 - O The RaceTrac plans to be in within 180 days. They have taken down part of the landscaping and the buffer will go in at the end of construction. There will be more landscaping that will go in by the CDD afterwards.
 - Envera things are going well.
 - They continue to be fully staffed in engineering.
 - They are currently working on new amenity software.
- Mr. Raybuck inquired about the recommendations included in the report.
 - o Dr. Entman noted hey will push the elevated crosswalk to next month.
 - Ms. Hollis noted the first estimate is extremely high and she will review it with Mr. Stilwell. There is drainage added that she believes is inflating the cost. The second one is for Marshall Creek to take over the landscaping for the fitness center.
 - Discussion continued on the fitness center landscaping with it being noted SCCDD has to agree.
- Ms. Moss addressed the parking issue and inquired if there is any update.
 - Ms. Hollis noted Jillian at the Club responded asking for specific documents which has been provided.

A. FEMA Update

- Dr. Entman addressed the District's cost of \$952,000. For FEMA they get 75% and 12.5% from the State. Of the roughly \$850,000 they are to receive they are waiting on \$10,000. Ms. Heath has done an excellent job staying with this.
- Mr. Riley addressed the bond issue on the amenities building inquiring if there are any
 repercussions off of it for when the real estate transferred, etcetera, and why they did not
 know about that.
 - o Ms. Hollis noted they do not produce the estoppels.

B. Traffic Report & SCCSO Roving Patrol Violation Log

- Mr. Riley reviewed the Traffic Report noting they are showing higher speeds again.
- The signs will be in Sebastian Square through the end of November.
- Ms. Moss addressed the roving patrol log noting there were 37 verbal or written warnings for stop sign violations. She inquired as to what the procedure is – first verbal, second written?
 - o Mr. Riley noted it is officer discretion.
 - O Discussion continued on violations and how they are documented.

SIXTH ORDER OF BUSINESS

District Manager's Report

- A. Consideration of the Audit Engagement with Berger, Toombs, Elam Gaines & Frank for Fiscal Year 2019
- Ms. Davis noted the District has a three-year engagement with Berger, Toomb, et al, however, they do like early engagements to be approved.

On MOTION by Mr. Raybuck seconded by Mr. Hoffman, with all in favor, the audit engagement for FY 2019 was approved.

B. Consideration of Motion to Assign Fund Balance at September 30, 2019

- Ms. Davis outlined the motion to assign fund balance noting it is something the auditors like to have. It matches what is on the September 30 financial statements.
- Discussion continued on reserves.

On MOTION by Mr. Hoffman seconded by Mr. Raybuck, with all in favor, the motion to assign fund balance at September 30, 2019 was approved.

- Mr. Riley noted the check register is in portrait format and inquired if it bothers anybody.
- Ms. Davis addressed the two formats for the financial statements the first is the new format and second is the old version. The hope is today the Board will come to agreement on which format they would like to go forward.
 - Discussion followed with the consensus of the Board being to go with the new format for the financial statements.

SEVENTH ORDER OF BUSINESS Attorney's Report

- Ms. Buchanan reported the Supreme Court rejected the review of the Dominos ADA website case.
- It was noted the MCCDD website is ADA compliant.

EIGHTH ORDER OF BUSINESS Supervisors' Requests

A. Policy for Charitable and Outside Events (Hoffman)

- Mr. Hoffman addressed organizations wanting to use District facilities. The way the decision has been made in the past is they do not give money to any outside agency or charity, they do not want to incur any cost or liability and cannot inconvenience residents. He addressed the tennis event for the Boggy Creek Camp. They have done it in the past and need to continue to do it. They should give Mr. Salmon permission to begin planning for the event to be held in April.
- Dr. Entman noted if they are going to use District assets it should come to management, at the least, as Mr. Salmon has done.
- Ms. Moss noted this will be the tenth year for the Boggy Creek Camp event and inquired if permission needs to be requested each year.
 - o Mr. Hoffman noted they should talk about it.
- Mr. Riley inquired if they should post pictures of the Board of Supervisors, so people know who they are.
 - O Ms. Hollis noted they would like to have headshots or a group picture for the website, so people know who the supervisors are.
 - o Mr. Riley noted he thinks that is fine, but they should also be posted at the facility.
 - o Ms. Hollis noted they will schedule the photo(s).
- Ms. Moss noted she had asked Ms. Hollis for a meet and greet for new residents.
 - o Ms. Hollis noted they will do one every four to five months.

NINTH ORDER OF BUSINESS

Acceptance of the September 2019 Financial Statements and Approval of the September 2019 Check Register and Invoices

• Dr. Entman inquired about the check to the Jacksonville USO.

 Ms. Gunia noted it was money donated at the street festival by residents and they wrote one check for the donation.

On MOTION by Mr. Hoffman seconded by Ms. Moss, with all in favor, the September 2019 financial statements were accepted, and the September check register and invoices were approved.

 Dr. Eric Agular, Republican Candidate for Congress, addressed Regalo Road noting he has been trying to reach out to the Commissioner and will continue to do so to see what can be done.

Marshall Creek CDD Operations Report for November CDD Meeting

Action Items from Meetings:

• Golf Club Agreement: Update: I met with Jillian and her counsel on November 4th. The Club has agreed that they are apart of the PUD. Marshall Creek CDD will stripe the last 6 parking spots in all 6 rows in a caution yellow. These 36 parking spots will now be overflow parking. I am working with Ryan Stillwell on a parking map that will visually show this to our residents and business owners. The Clubs legal counsel is working on a memorandum of understanding for Katie B to review. Once reviewed our Board can formally adopt. BIG kudos to our own Ryan and Katie B. This was not an easy task.

Administration:

- Our first new resident reception is scheduled for 11/19. 56 invitations have been created and sent via mail. Currently, we have 17 RSVPs.
- Supervisor name tags have been ordered for our formal events/meetings.
- Completed a walk of the fitness center with Jill Burns. We reviewed all items that are needed/or being completed to keep that center up to standards.
- Met with residents from Trails Edge Court. These residents are concerned regarding
 the amount of vehicles parked in the area during school drop off and pick-up. I am
 brainstorming on some ways we as the CDD can help the situation since street
 parking is permitted. Supervisor Riley is working with me on this.
- Creating new room/pavilion reservation forms for room reservations.
- Vinelle and I completed a class required by First Service on Slips, Trips and Falls.
- Janice Eggleton Davis has provide an adjacent property owner notice to the District.
- SJSO schedule created and communicated to our scheduler for the month of November.
- SJSO Violation Log and back-up reports.
- Radar sign speed data created and attached.

Amenities report from Erin:

 Two very successful Food Truck Fridays. The second one was a combination of events. The attendance was probably double of what the average FTF has historically been. I received a lot of positive feedback from the residents and shop owners on Market Street.

- Specifics for the Fall Festival were nailed down. Added electrical outlets on Market Street will be helpful to host more vendors and to decrease the noise from generators.
- Hired more front desk and child watch staff.
- Had several meetings regarding the survey results. Sweetwater is very interested in the results and want to use it as a tool in making their decision for community updates.
- The Jaguars Community trip to see the Saints was successful and well received.
- Worked with Jill Burns in getting bids regarding Fitness Facility improvements. The pergola is to be replaced, the mirrors in the gym repaired, the roof pressure washed, the inside and outside of the building painted and other additions.
- Had several meetings and conversations with residents and staff
- Added new classes for both the Fitness Center and the Amenity Center. I am
 making constant efforts to balance our classes to best suit the residents. Many of
 the classes have great attendance and the instructors are well liked.
- Continued research and demos for front desk software continued. We are currently
 making progress with a vendor in hopes to increase our ability to serve the residents
 fast and with more options.
- Plans for the Tree Lighting Ceremony continued. New vendors contacted as each year this event has exceeded expected numbers.
- Repairs and purchases were made for the equipment at the Fitness Center and Amenity Center for classes and gym use.
- Daily management of staff and responsibilities
- Reservations were made for both individual events as well as reoccurring events in both the CDD meeting room and the small room.
- More seminars were scheduled in the Amenity Center as well as painting classes and nutritional instruction.
- Worked with the Palencia Club staff to coordinate our events. Our goal is to not have our events be scheduled on the same day to increase attendance for both entities.
- Attended a meeting with many of the business owners of Market Street. The goal of
 the meeting was to increase and improve our communication so that we can create
 events and support events and businesses on Market Street. The owners were
 enthusiastic about creating a night life for Market Street and to make the Palencia
 Community even more appealing and enjoyable for the residents. The idea of a
 Saturday Stroll hosted by the owners was proposed.

Claims:

 Northgate guard house was hit by a delivery truck. Mark-it Right Builders will be repairing the ceiling of the guard house the week of November 11th. These are repairs are being covered by the driver of the truck. The gate arms will be in the open position for a few days while these repairs are being made.

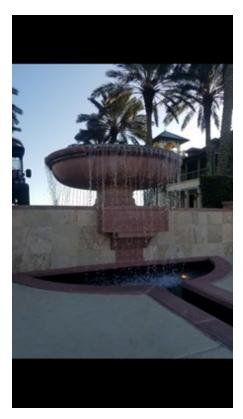
Letter from the Marshall Creek CDD Chairman.

Gates:

- Monthly conference call with account manager to ensure all post orders are being followed and any misc. items are addressed if needed.
- No soliciting signage has been ordered to replace our old signage. It will be placed at both gates and along Palencia Village Drive on existing poles.
- The Southgate resident arm and operator will be changed out to match Envera's existing equipment. This will allow an easy fix (pop-in arm) if the arm is knocked off. After this change all of our gate entries at the North and South gates will all have all new operators and arms. Our exits are still the previous operators and arms. At this point we will continue to monitor their function.

Engineering report from Roy and Shane:

- Pressure washing of curbs and sidewalks
- Boardwalk #6 has had a refurbishment.
- New steam generator for the men's steam room has been installed at the Amenity center.
- Village green fountain had its semiannual maintenance.



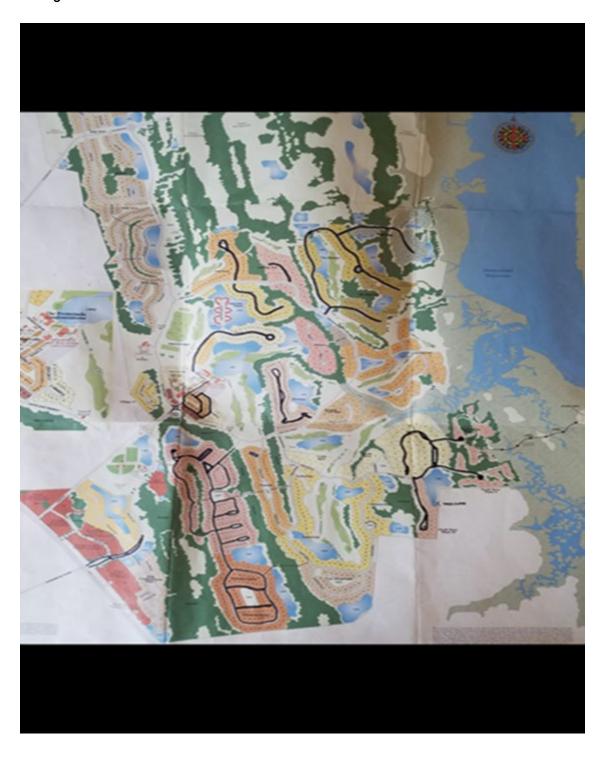


- New motors were installed in the Village Green fountain.
- The front entrance of the Amenity center has been freshened up.
- The pump at the Leaning tree lift station was replaced.
- A new slide was ordered for the Oak common playscape.
- Grinding, scarifying and replacement of sidewalks throughout the community.
- 32 FMX work orders were completed this month.

Landscape report from Jim:

- Turf weed applications
- Preventative application to areas of St Augustine turf that historically gets disease this time of year
- Installed four pallets of St Augustine sod
- Continue to spray palmetto and weeds in all the parks that were under brushed ahead of pine straw
- Started winter projects with wood line cutback ahead of the pine straw
- Built a new irrigation zone to support new plant material at Parkside Park
- Built a 100' 7 riser irrigation zone line on the Palencia Club Dr, and installed new plant material
- Repaired a 2", 3", and a 4" irrigation main line. The 4" break was under the road in a sleeve
- Replaced a 2" irrigation valve
- Rebuilt a 2" irrigation valve
- Replaced a float valve at Riley well
- Repaired two irrigation zone line breaks
- Installed new plant material at the Amenities Center

Legal:

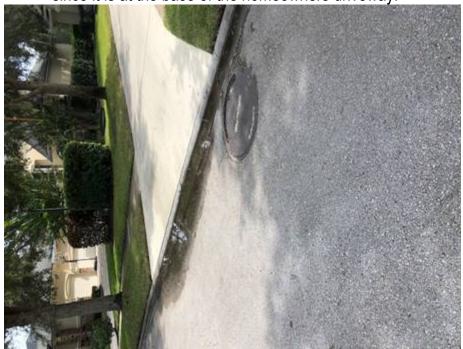
 Billing for the plumbing disconnect on Spanish Marsh was sent certified mail on 10/31/2019. At this point, I have not received any response.

Notable Issues:

• On November 4th one of our landscaping employees was assaulted. The person jumped into our golf cart, punched our employee and then stole our golf cart. The person was arrested and golf cart was found. If you would like additional details on this incident please come and see me.



The curbing and asphalt in front of 641 Treehouse Circle will be repaired within the
next few weeks. We have quite a few locations holding water now as a result of the
oak trees not allowing the streets to drain as intended. We are addressing this one
since it is at the base of the homeowners driveway.



Ongoing Items:

- Weekly staff meeting held with the CDD department heads
- · Bi-weekly landscaping ride with Jim
- Amenity/Building Cameras
- Mercado Clean-up
- Insuring lateral sewer lines
- Investigating new amenity systems for fitness and pool.
- Independent Contractor and Personal Trainer contracts have been created. I am
 reviewing these with Erin and Vinelle to implement. Contracts will be sent to Katie B.
 for the final ok. These contracts will be put into place to get us out of the business of
 collecting money for outside contractors from residents and then turning around and
 paying the contractor. Also, the goal is to have a uniform policy for our outside
 amenity contractors (personal trainers, seminar host, swim instructors, group fitness,
 etc).
- I am working on a guest sign-in sheet for the amenity building and fitness center. At the bottom of the sign-in sheet will be an acknowledgement for the waiver and

release. I received a copy of what the Tolomato Community Development District (Nocatee) uses. I will be reviewing this with Katie B prior to implementation.

Projects:

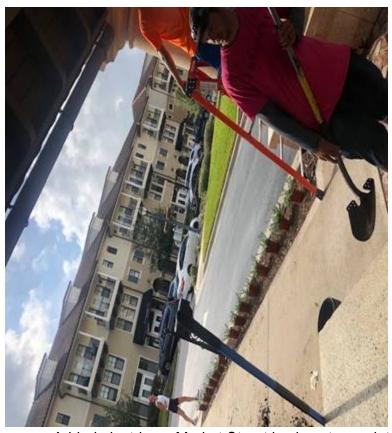
• Our business fronts received facelifts. A big thanks to Shane and Jim for moving fast before the holidays. The amenity center has new landscaping and paint. The Tennis Center has newly painted shutters.











- Added electric on Market Street is almost completed. We will now have electrical outlets on both sides of the streets to accommodate events, lightening, etc. One each side of Market Street we will now have (1) 125 amp single phase service and (2) 50 amp 240 volt 4 wire receptacles and (2) 20 amp weather and tamper resistant GFCI receptacles in lockage in-use cover mounted on vinyl garden posts.
- Trees have been lifted across from the Market Street porkchop. This area will be getting a landscaping face lift which will be a show stopper as you enter the area. I also envision our future Garden Club maintain planter boxes in this area.



- Fence bids for the Village Green have been completed. Hardwick will be completing the work. All fencing around Village Green will be replaced.
- Doug Sencal with the Market Street sub-association (Palencia Live/Work Townhomes) has made great progress on the Market Street relaunch plan. In addition to having their rear garbage areas enclosed with decorative vinyl fencing Doug is a BIG reason Market Street continues to improve. He serves as the association President.
- The CDD and the surrounding sub-associations all came together to get our directional sign updated.



 Boardwalk 6 is safe again. All boards have been replaced. The refurbishment looks amazing.





Recommendations:

- All entry street lines (white lines) on Palencia Village Drive need to be re-painted with
 the beads for high visibility. These lines have faded over time. We have the
 capability to do this in-house, but we chicken feed our beads, which is not as
 effective as a commercial vendors process. I recommend we have Preferred
 Material quote this project as they are familiar with our street due to their recent
 paving and striping.
- Now that the growing season is almost over I would like to recommend that we give
 Augustine Island a 30-day notice for maintaining their landscaping. We receive
 \$1000.00 a month, but in exchange spend approximately 13 man hours. I feel these
 man hours would be better used throughout the district and possibly at the Fitness
 Center down the road.

Tennis:

- Held our annual Oktoberfest Tennis Social...We had over 25 players participating in the 2-1/2 hr mixed up round robin...Great "FUN" was had by all!!!
- Preparing for our upcoming Junior Tournament, Sat Nov. 9th...Anticipating 40 to 60 juniors playing in the one day event.
- Repainting shutters on the outside of the Tennis Pro Shop...Face-lift.
- Replacing windscreens, nets, and adding clay material on the courts that need it.

Re: Marshall Creek CDD Landscape Maintenance Obligations for Promenade Easement

Dear Marshall Creek CDD Board Members:

My name is Christopher Cobb and I am a resident on 688 Promenade Pt. Drive, St. Augustine, Florida. I am writing concerning the CCD's lack of maintenance and *de facto* abandonment of responsibility concerning the property behind the Promenade Pt. Dr. property owners. While I am writing this letter on my own behalf, a number of my neighbors may join in this request for action and correspondence.

We are in receipt of Ms. Buchanan's April 17, 2019 "Memorandum" to the CDD board. We whole-heartedly disagree with the opinion expressed in the Memorandum and would like to take this opportunity to respond. Thank you in advance for reading this letter in its entirety.

For ease of reference, I am attaching the following items to this letter:

- 1. Special Warranty Deed and Assignment of Easements between Promenade Development, LLC and Marshall Creek Community Development District dated June 21, 2005, recorded at OR 2569, Pg. 1892, St. Johns County Official Records.
- 2. Promenade Pointe II, Plat from Map Book 50, Pg. 59.
- 3. Prosser Hallock Typical Rear Fencing Guideline Plan. August 19, 2005.

The Property and Brief Background

For purposes of this letter the "Property" will be defined as the sloped land behind the Promenade Pt. Dr. residences and the top of the CDD Promenade retaining wall. This Property is well known in the community and highly visible to all residents who use the CDD Promenade walking path, socialize at the club house or view any marketing material for the community. The

Property also benefits the golf course, lending a beautiful aesthetic to the 18th finishing hole and to residents who are dining at the Palencia Clubhouse. Additionally, the Property serves as a backdrop to many photographs taken during weddings and special events. To deny that this feature is a central aesthetic feature of Palencia would be disingenuous. Additionally, a simple review of Zillow or Realtor.com of the houses listed for sale in Palencia will show most of the listings utilize photographs of the Property to advertise the aesthetic beauty of the community.

Unfortunately, the current CDD board has elected to not acknowledge this feature and has elected to abandon its obligations surrounding it. We do not believe the law or the CDD course of conduct / performance allows the CDD neglect its long standing maintenance obligation.

For the last 9+ months the CDD has ignored and out right refused to perform maintenance on the Property. This obligation was historically performed by the CDD since it received the assignment of the easement from the original developer (document attached). Also attached, please find 2 pdf documents: Promenade Pointe Typical Fencing Plan. Both documents describe/reference the 25' easement along the back of the Property. More particularly the documents show:

Promenade Pointe II Document, pg. 2, General Notes #6:

"25' Promenade easement shown hereon is for Drainage, Irrigation, *Landscape* and *Maintenance*."

<u>Promenade Pointe Typical Fence Plan, pg. 2, to the right of the map:</u> Names that portion of lots the, "25' Wide *Landscaped Promenade Easement*".

These documents demonstrate Marshall Creek CDD as the dominant estate holder over the land with the palm trees and has through its conduct, established a course of performance that it cannot now reverse or refuse. We believe this to be undisputed. Such rights were freely assigned by the developer and voluntarily accepted by the CDD.

Definition of Common Area Includes the Promenade Easement

Under the Palencia Declarations, "Common Area" is defined as follows:

All real property (<u>including easements</u>, licenses and rights to use real property) and personal property located within or adjacent to the Property, if any, which is owned by the Developer, or by the Association, and which the Developer has designated for the common use of the Owners by reference thereto in this Section 2.6, or by recording a Supplementary Declaration, pursuant to the terms of Section 4.3 hereof. The Common Area initially designated by the Developer shall consist of the real property (and interests therein) more particularly described on Exhibit D



attached hereto and made a part hereof together with all improvement constructed therein by Developer, but not owned or maintained by a public or private utility company.

Clearly stated, the easement rights of the POA which were assigned to the CDD are legally deemed Common Area. Since there is no Developer designated area in Exhibit D, there is no question that the easement rights for the Promenade Property are for the POA, which the developer assigned to the CDD. As such, the CDD cannot now disclaim or abandon this easement existing on the recorded Plat and Community Documents.

Statement of Requirement Maintenance by Marshall Creek CDD

After approximately 18 years of fulfilling their obligations under the duly plat recorded 25' Promenade Pointe Easement, the CDD board has deliberately decided to violate the terms of the easement, namely the requirement to maintain their irrigation, drainage and landscaping within the easement. The property is now in a state of disrepair with weeds and overgrowth taking over the entire area. To be clear, the landowners who live on Promenade do not benefit from this area. We do not see it, we are told by the POA we cannot touch it and any proposed alteration of it would most likely be denied by the POA or any ARC committee.

Historically, the CDD has taken action under the privileges and obligations of the duly recorded plat and easement by virtue of the assignment. They have provided drainage, installed irrigation and planted or re-planted landscaping. The CDD is obligated to maintain the drainage system. If the drainage system no longer drains properly, the CDD must fix it. The CDD is obligated to maintain the irrigation system. If a pipe bursts, the CDD must fix it or remove the piping. The CDD is obligated to maintain their landscaping. If the plants grow, they must be pruned. If the plants die, they must be replaced or removed. If the pine straw deteriorates, it must be replenished or raked up and hauled away.

A review of the Fiscal Year 2019 Adopted Budget (document is not attached) shows the history of the landscaping expenses within the community. Of note on page 21 of the Budget Narrative, you will find "one of the 2019 <u>major projects</u> include sodding the lake bank along Promenade wall..." despite this designation, this work has not been completed, yet the CDD has budgeted for this cost. These amounts should be reallocated to maintain the Promenade Easement.

Marshall Creek CDD is Breaching its Easement Obligation and Duty to Maintain

The CDD is not permitted to refuse its maintenance obligation. The course of dealing and course of performance for the last fifteen (15) years dictates the CDD resume its landscape maintenance immediately. Certainly equity dictates the CDD resume its obligation. The CDD is already performing irrigation of the land. Such action of irrigation constitutes a partial form of



maintenance. It would appear the CDD is now only selecting which parts it whimsically wishes to perform. Such selective and irrational action is what has now led to a significant dispute with the Palencia Property Owners.

The POA has discussed and debated this issue at open board meetings and seemingly agrees with the residence of Promenade by suspending any fines for lack of maintenance of the Property. I have spoken to the POA counsel personally and he has openly discussed that the CDD course of performance does not favor their recent decision. The POA is in such agreement that in July 2019, they voted to stay any fine enforcement proceedings against the Promenade Property Owners. Apparently, the POA agrees it would be unconscionable to fine its residents because the CDD is not performing its maintenance.

CDD Failed Maintenance is Causing Harm to Property Owners

By refusing to perform maintenance, the CDD has caused an unhealthy and unsafe environment for Property Owners on Promenade Point. Further, the CDD's failure to perform its maintenance is harming the aesthetical appearance of the community. Specifically, their inaction has:

- > Created a habitat for wild animals and poisonous snakes in the Property.
- > Created a private nuisance.
- > Interfered with the Property Owner's use and enjoyment of their land.
- Created a detrimental impact on a community amenity (i.e. the Promenade Walkway)
- ➤ Endangered Property owner's with being hit by heavy palm fronds falling from 25-30 feet up. Property Owners often cite to hazards because of all the debris falling off the trees.
- ➤ Caused the Property Owner's to be inundated with insects, the likes of which we have not seen in the four plus years we've lived here.
- ➤ Placed a strain on our pool's mechanical equipment by all of the palm debris dropping from the untrimmed tree and weed pollen blowing into the pools.

<u>Note</u>: Per the covenants on the Promenade Pointe lots affected by the easement, we are not allowed to screen in our pools. Because the easement requires the CDD to maintain their irrigation, drainage and landscaping, the covenant was acceptable, if not ideal. Since violating the terms of the easement, the debris from these untrimmed palms are causing staining on Property patios and pool surfaces. *This covenant and the easement were put into place to insure a certain aesthetic for the enjoyment of the community using the promenade walkway and for the Palencia Club*. No other Palencia homeowners have this restriction.



Further, we have removed 4 snakes from our pool drains this season alone. That exceeds the entire number the three years prior. 2 were poisonous.

The original developer certainly understood the need for uniformity on Promenade Pointe as those parcels, as constructed would be highly visible for the entire community. Palencia itself markets the community with photographs and video of the lake and the Property. The CDD refusal to conduct its maintenance on the Property is affecting this feature. The need for consistency was clearly recognized by the original developer who was maintaining AND which the CDD chose to continue for 18 years. This hasty and unexpected cessation of maintenance is not historically supported and certainly not equitable considering the long history of maintenance by the CDD.

Request for Relief

While I will be unable because of travel to attend the November 2019 CDD meeting, I believe a number of my neighbors may want to address the concerns. Please accept this letter in lieu of my personal appearance and presentation. We respectfully request the CDD to recommence it obligation to maintain the Property as it has done so in the past. At a minimum, we request the budget line item for re-sodding the lake be reallocated to conduct palm tree pruning and replanting of the Muhly grass and mulch on the Property.

Thank you for your attention to this matter.

My name is Patricia Luciano and I am a resident on 684 Promenade Pointe Drive, St. Augustine, Florida. I am writing concerning the CDD's breach of obligation under the terms of the 25' Promenade Easement. I am writing this letter on behalf of myself and my neighbors listed in the signatory at the end of the letter.

We are in receipt of Ms. Buchanan's April 17, 2019 "Memorandum" to the CDD board. Upon examination of the terms of the easement, we find the opinion expressed in the Memorandum to be in conflict with the obligations of the CDD as set forth in the easement. We would like to take this opportunity to respond. Thank you in advance for reading this letter in its entirety.

A. <u>Description</u>

Definitions:

<u>Property</u> is defined as the property subject to the 25' easement; the sloped land behind the Promenade Pt. Dr. residences and the top of the Promenade retaining wall.

Promenade Pointe II represents the first 9 lots on the street.

Promenade Pointe I represents the rest of the lots through the end of the street.

<u>Dominate Estate Holder</u> is the CDD whose rights with respect to the Property were freely assigned by the developer and voluntarily accepted by the CDD.

This Property is unique.

- It is well known in the community
- It is highly visible to all residents who use the CDD Promenade walking path, dine at the club house or view any marketing material for the community.
- It provides an aesthetically pleasing and valuable asset to the golf club's finishing hole, #18.
- Property Owners are not allowed to screen in their pools in order to adhere to the conformity requirements set by the developer. No other Palencia property owners have this restriction.

The attached pdf documents, Promenade Pointe II Plat with Easements and Promenade Pointe I Declarations and Covenants, both describe/reference the 25' easement along the back of the Property and clearly define the landscape and maintenance easement acquired by the CDD.

<u>Promenade Pointe II Document, pg. 2, General Notes #6</u>: "25' Promenade easement shown hereon is for Drainage, Irrigation, Landscape and Maintenance."

<u>Promenade Pointe I Document, pg. 2, to the right of the map</u>: Names that portion of our lots the, "25' Wide Landscaped Promenade Easement".

These documents demonstrate Marshall Creek CDD as the dominant estate holder over the Property and has through its conduct, established a course of performance that it cannot now reverse or refuse. We believe this to be undisputed.

B. Obligation to Maintain

After approximately 18 years of fulfilling their obligations under the duly recorded 25' Promenade Pointe Easement, the CDD board has deliberately decided to violate the terms of the easement, namely to maintain their irrigation, drainage and landscaping. The property is now in a state of disrepair with weeds and overgrowth taking over the entire area. To be clear, the Property owners, who pay real estate taxes on the property, do not benefit from this area. We do not see it, we are told we cannot touch it and any proposed alteration of it would most likely be denied by the POA or any ARB committee.

The CDD has taken action under the privileges and obligations of the duly plat recorded easement.

- <u>They have provided drainage</u>, The CDD is obligated to maintain the drainage system. If the drainage system no longer drains properly, the CDD must fix it.
- <u>They have installed irrigation</u>. The CDD is obligated to maintain the irrigation system. If a pipe bursts, the CDD must fix it or remove the piping. The property owners have no access to, or control over, the irrigation system.
- They have planted and re-planted landscaping. The CDD is obligated to maintain their landscaping. If the plants grow, they must be pruned. If the plants die, they must be replaced or removed. If the pine straw deteriorates, it must be replenished or raked up and hauled away.

The CDD was allowed to place their "equipment", drainage, piping and plants, on our property by virtue of the easement. They must maintain their "equipment" as demanded by the terms of the easement. No person or entity has the right to debase another's private property and that is what the CDD has done.

C. Marshall Creek CDD is Breaching its Easement Obligation and Duty to Maintain

The CDD is not now able to refuse its maintenance obligation, which it has done. The course of dealing for the last eighteen (18) years dictates that the CDD resume its landscape maintenance.

The Palencia Property Owners Association has seemingly agreed with the residents of Promenade by suspending any fines for lack of maintenance. This same argument we present now to the CDD was met with resounding approval by the POA and their counsel.

D. CDD Breach of Obligation is Causing Harm to Property Owners

By virtue of nonperformance of their obligations under the easement, the CDD has caused an unhealthy and unsafe environment for Property Owners. Further, the CDD's failure to perform its maintenance is harming the aesthetic appearance of the community. Specifically, their violation of the terms of the easement has:

- Created a private nuisance.
- Created a habitat for wild animals and poisonous snakes in the Property.
- Caused the Property Owners to be inundated with insects, the likes of which we have not seen before.
- Endangered Property Owners with being hit by heavy palm fronds falling from 25-30 feet up. Property Owners often cite to hazards because of all the debris falling off the trees.
- Interfered with the Property Owners' use and enjoyment of their parcels.
- Placed a strain on Property Owners' pool's mechanicals by all of the palm debris dropping from the untrimmed trees and weed pollen blowing into the pools.
- Created a detrimental impact on a community amenity (i.e. the Promenade Walkway)

<u>Note</u>: Per the covenants on the Promenade Pointe lots affected by the easement, Property Owners are not allowed to screen in their pools. <u>No other Palencia homeowners have this restriction</u>. Because the easement requires the CDD to maintain their irrigation, drainage and landscaping, the covenant was acceptable, if not ideal. Since violating the terms of the easement, the debris from these untrimmed palms are causing staining on patios and pool surfaces, in addition to the aforementioned strain on equipment.

This covenant and the easement were put into place to insure a certain aesthetic for the enjoyment of the community using the promenade walkway and for the Palencia Club.

The original developer certainly understood the need for uniformity on Promenade Pointe as those parcels, as constructed would be highly visible for the entire community. Palencia markets the community with photographs and video of the lake and the Property. By violating the terms of the easement requiring the CDD to maintain their landscaping, the CDD has ruined the uniformity that the original developer required. The CDD was maintaining this uniformity for approximately 18 years. This hasty and unexpected cessation of maintenance is not historically supported and certainly not equitable considering the long history of maintenance by the CDD and their obligations under the easement.

E. Request for Relief

We respectfully request the CDD to recommence it's obligation to maintain the Property as it has done so in the past and is required to do under the terms of the easement.

Please accept this letter as notification that If the CDD does not remedy their failures by starting to clean up the area within 30 days, we may individually spray all the vegetation on our property within the easement to eliminate this unhealthy habitat and protect our families and our property. In so doing, the plantings owned by the CDD may be killed. It is such a mess out there that selective spraying would be unrealistic. <u>Such action on our part in no way changes the easement or releases the CDD from their duty and obligations under the easement.</u>
