MINUTES OF MEETING MARSHALL CREEK COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT

The regular meeting of the Board of Supervisors of the Marshall Creek Community Development District was held on Wednesday, May 18, 2022 at 4:00 p.m. at Marshall Creek Amenity Center, 625 Palencia Club Drive, St. Augustine, Florida and via conference line at 646-838-1601.

The following is a summary of the discussions and actions taken.

FIRST ORDER OF BUSINESS

• Mr. Hoffman called the meeting to order and the Board and Staff identified themselves for the record.

SECOND ORDER OF BUSINESS

- Ms. Marilyn Costanza addressed street trees noting Ms. Hollis had advised her to submit a request to the ARB and it was denied.
 - Ms. Hollis will coordinate a response from POA.
- Ms. Costanza also addressed a sidewalk issue in Oak Common.

THIRD ORDER OF BUSINESS

Public Hearing to Consider Adoption of Service Rates for Responding to Gate Strikes

Audience Comments

Roll Call

On MOTION by Dr. Entman seconded by Ms. Perna, with all in favor, the public hearing was opened.

- Mr. Hoffman noted he does not think they need this, and he does not like the varying fee.
- Mr. Luciano noted he thought the discussion had been about flagrant violations.
- Ms. Perna noted it was not intended for those who hit by accident or where the gate comes down too fast. This is for those who willfully damage the gate.
- Ms. Moss noted she thinks the fee is exorbitant and if they are going to have a fee it should be a set fee, rather than a discretionary one.
- Dr. Entman addressed the fee range noting Ms. Hollis would have that discretion if someone were to receive a penalty.
- Mr. Luciano noted he believes it \$0 to \$250 not \$50 to \$250.
- Mr. Larry McGinnis inquired if a first violation letter would go out prior or is the first offense punishable.
 - Ms. Perna noted this is for extreme circumstances. This is so they have the ability, and it is in place.
- Ms. Laurelle Zamparelli noted she thinks they have clarified it gives them the ability to charge a fee, not a requirement to do so.

On MOTION by Ms. Perna seconded by Dr. Entman, with Ms. Perna, Dr. Entman and Mr. Luciano voting aye and Mr. Hoffman and Ms. Moss voting nay, Resolution 2022-4 a resolution of the Board of Supervisors of Marshall Creek Community Development District adopting rates regarding services in response to gate strikes; providing a severability clause; and providing an effective date was adopted. 3-2

On MOTION by Dr. Entman seconded by Mr. Luciano, with all in favor, the public hearing was closed.

FOURTH ORDER OF BUSINESS

Approval of Minutes of the April 20, 2022 Meeting

On MOTION by Mr. Luciano seconded by Ms. Perna, with all in favor, the minutes of the March 16, 2022 meeting were approved.

A. **Discussion of Open Items**

There being none, the next item followed.

FIFTH ORDER OF BUSINESS

Engineer's Report

- Mr. Stilwell distributed a proposal regarding HB 53 Stormwater Management Needs Analysis Report and outlined the reporting now required and noted it is due to be filed by June 30th.
- Mr. Hoffman inquired if the reporting needs to be done every year.
 - Mr. Stilwell noted it is every five years. 0
- Ms. Hollis addressed budgeting for future reporting.
- Dr. Entman noted it seems the cost of doing this is almost as much as the cost of replacing whatever needs to be replaced in the five-year plan and inquired if there is a way to give them a bond of \$100,000 to say if something needs replaced and they do not replace it, you can hire somebody rather than going through an exercise like this.
 - Mr. Stilwell noted not that he is aware of. He inquired if Mr. Johnson had any 0 experience with pushback to the state level.
 - Mr. Johnson stated unfortunately we are in the world of unfunded mandates from 0 the State of Florida. There is not an alternative to doing the study. Each study from each special district gets filed with the County, and the County then does a Master Study that gets filed with the State of Florida.

On MOTION by Dr. Entman seconded by Mr. Hoffman, with all in favor, the Prosser proposal for the Stormwater Management Needs Analysis Report in an amount not to exceed \$10,000 was approved.

SIXTH ORDER OF BUSINESS

A.

General Manager's Operations Report Traffic Report & SJCSO Roving Patrol Violation Log

- Ms. Hollis further reviewed her report in the agenda package and provided updates:
 - Reported on the budget noting they will get the SCCDD numbers on June 1st. 0

B. **Discussion of Community Survey**

- Ms. Hollis addressed the survey results noting they included a couple of categories.
 - An education category where they educate through email blasts to the community 0 on Envera, the County park, pool hours, golf carts past the roundabout, O&M history, SJSO hours, the front area (commercial POA), and an amenity map.

- Changes to consider that were pulled from the comments Guest policies.
- Discussion ensued on Guest policies with it being noted it is currently eight guests.
- Ms. Hollis will draft a proposal of changes.
- Ms. Moss inquired if changes apply to tennis.
- Ms. Hollis noted a tennis guest would not be able to use the owners' code on the gate and would have to be with the owner.
- Ms. Davis noted if there are any rates that are different with the published/adopted policy they will have to go through the rulemaking/rate setting process.
- Ms. Katherine Hutchinson addressed getting new cards noting two said guest pass.
- Ms. Hollis noted they get 30 guest passes for pool and 30 for fitness. The current policy is they get 30 passes and if they want to buy more they can, but they have to be with their guests.
- Ms. Hollis noted for requested amenities, there was nothing new in the survey responses.
- Ms. Hollis addressed the Poolsure increase of 8%. Additionally, she noted Florida has been added to the national concrete shortage.
- Ms. Hollis addressed Lakes L and X1 noting the irrigation for the golf course comes from these ponds. They have been struggling to keep these ponds looking good and doing well. This past week they removed four massive alligators that were eating the Triploid Grass Carp. The ponds have been restocked.
- Mr. Hoffman addressed SCCDD being in the process of deciding how to expand the fitness center. He noted he no longer suggests MCCDD should provide their input as he does not think they are unanimous on what they would recommend to SCCDD.
 - Discussion followed on what the additional needs are per the survey more pickleball courts, another family pool, fitness center updates, expansion of the dog park. It was suggested that individual Board members could speak with SCCDD on a one-on-one basis.
 - Discussion ensued on a joint meeting with SCCCD and Mr. Hoffman noted he had offered, and they were not interested. Dr. Entman suggested a joint meeting be advertised and encourage the SCCDD residents to attend. Mr. Hoffman suggested

Ms. Perna speak with Mr. Rob Lisotta about a joint meeting to discuss budgets and amenity plans.

• Mr. Denman noted SCCDD has a new Board member and maybe after the election in November they may be more receptive.

SEVENTH ORDER OF BUSINESS District Manager's Report

A. Discussion of Preliminary Proposed FY 2023 Budget to Provide to Sweetwater Creek CDD

- Ms. Davis addressed the projections for the remainder of FY 2022 as well as the proposed budget for FY 2023. The purpose of the discussion today is to meet the requirement under the Interlocal Agreement to provide a proposed budget to SCCDD by June 1st and expecting to receive theirs the same day. The expected Revenue from SCCDD is based on MCCDD numbers. However, under Expenditures for Shared Expenses, it is the same as it is from FY 2022 until they receive SCCDD's budget.
- Mr. Hoffman noted MCCDD pays 2/3 of the SCCDD costs for amenities and SCCDD pays 1/3 of the MCCDD costs.
- Mr. Hoffman addressed inflationary pressures, particularly in wages, and it has been offset in the budget by less contribution to reserves than in previous years, but they have tried to keep fees [assessments] the same. The Reserve Study currently underway may impact next year's budget.
- Ms. Hollis addressed contributions to Reserves.
- Mr. Luciano noted he is not concerned about a reduction in Reserves, but rather how much they have available. In general, the budget looks fine to him.
- Ms. Moss noted she is fine with the budget as is.
- Dr. Entman noted landscaping in the budget is double from this year's actual. He inquired where they are with landscaping given that they do not have the employees they need to have.
 - Ms. Hollis noted she thinks it is a rotating door they have employees who will work overtime, or they are working them hard to get things done, and they have outsourced quite a few things. There are probably a lot of areas that they just have not noticed, but the guys have done a good job of scrambling to keep up.

- Mr. Hoffman noted the budget is not forecasting a huge increase in landscape expenses.
- Ms. Davis noted she received an email from SCCDD questioning the number of units MCCDD is using in the shared expense calculation and asking that neighborhood commercial be included in the number of units.
 - Mr. Hoffman noted it is per the contract.
 - Ms. Davis noted she needs to look at this. The commercial units up front do not get assessed for amenities because they do not get access to them. It is only the neighborhood commercial that does, and she believes they are counted in the units already.
- Mr. Hoffman noted if there are specific line items anyone wants to suggest a revision to in this draft, they can do it at the June meeting.

On MOTION by Dr. Entman seconded by Ms. Perna, with all in favor, authorizing the FY 2023 budget as presented be sent to SCCDD by June 1, 2022, was approved.

B. Report on Number of Registered Voters – 2,723

• Ms. Davis reported there are 2,723 registered voters as of April 15, 2022.

EIGHTH ORDER OF BUSINESS Attorney's Report

• Mr. Jonathan Johnson sitting in for Mr. Eckert, noted he has no specific report but is happy to answer any specific questions they may have.

NINTH ORDER OF BUSINESS Supervisors' Requests

A. Discussion of Flashing Crosswalk Lights (Supervisor Hoffman)

- Mr. Hoffman addressed installing flashing lights at the crosswalk from in front of Avila across to Palencia Village Drive. Mr. Eckert had provided that they do not have the authority to do this as it is controlled by the County and the CDD cannot just arbitrarily put up flashing lights.
 - Mr. Johnson noted they would have to coordinate with the County, because the County does have the authority to do it. He agrees with Mr. Eckert that the CDD does not have the authority, but they could work out an agreement with the County if they are willing to come in and do it, most likely at CDD cost.

- Mr. Hoffman inquired what the Board's thoughts were on working with the County to install at the CDD's cost.
- Dr. Entman noted he is in agreement.
- Mr. Stilwell noted they would want to work with the County and permit it through the County.
- Ms. Hollis noted the estimated cost is \$7,500.
- Discussion ensued on a previous thought of a cart path.
- Mr. Hoffman requested the sense of the Board on whether they should approach the County with the consensus being yes.
- Discussion continued on additional roadway striping.

B. Discussion of Street Tree Planning (Supervisor Entman)

- Dr. Entman noted provided a handout regarding street trees noting he believes they are close to a crisis situation. There are close to 900 Live Oaks that belong to residents that are street trees as opposed to trees on MCCDD property. The trees were planted by Hines as part of the tree mitigation. He addressed the roots of the trees and the costs of repairs. He believes the more responsible approach would be removing the trees that are causing the damage today and thinking about removing some of the trees in the future that are going to cause damage in the future. 30 plus trees have been identified as causing damage today and should be removed.
- Mr. Luciano addressed the trees on Oak Common. He noted he thinks they should take a proactive approach, but he believes it is a partnership between the CDD and the resident, and possibly the POA.
- Ms. Hollis addressed the repairs of curb aprons.
- Mr. Hoffman addressed maybe doing some portion of the 30 in the first year.
- Mr. Stilwell addressed the mitigation of trees and proactively establishing criteria with the County that allows the CDD to remove the trees.
 - Ms. Hollis noted in speaking with the County, if a tree is damaging CDD infrastructure and needs to be removed based on the acreage the tree would not need to be replaced.
- Mr. McGinnis addressed getting an arborist to provide a plan. He noted there are ways to do root trimming to mitigate damage to the tree.

- Discussion followed on removing trees, if there is a need to replace removed trees, what would be a suitable replacement and exploring options to removal.
- Ms. Hollis will invite Mr. Charles Florida to attend the July meeting to discuss trees.
- Mr. McGinnis raised a question regarding the ARB.
 - Mr. Hoffman inquired of Mr. Johnson if the CDD needs ARB permission to remove a tree.
 - Mr. Johnson noted it is a good question and they will have to look at it.
- The consensus of the Board is to be more proactive with the 30 problem trees.

TENTH ORDER OF BUSINESS

Acceptance of the April 2022 Financial Statements and Approval of the April 2022 Check Register and Invoices

On MOTION by Mr. Luciano seconded by Dr. Entman, with all in favor, the April 2022 financial statements were accepted, and the April 2022 check register and invoices were approved.

SUMMARY OF COMPUTATIONAL INFORMATION AND DEFINITIONS

COMPUTATIONAL INFORMATION

- 1. For the purpose of computing Rebatable Arbitrage, investment activity is reflected from May 6, 2016, the date of the closing, to May 6, 2021, the Computation Date. All nonpurpose payments and receipts are future valued to the Computation Date of May 6, 2021.
- 2. Computations of yield are based on a 360-day year and semiannual compounding on the last day of each compounding interval. Compounding intervals end on a day in the calendar year corresponding to Bond maturity dates or six months prior.
- 3. For investment cash flow, debt service and yield computation purposes, all payments and receipts are assumed to be paid or received respectively, as shown on the attached schedules.
- 4. Purchase prices on investments are assumed to be at fair market value, representing an arm's length transaction.
- 5. During the period between May 6, 2016 and May 6, 2021, the District made periodic payments into the Debt Service Fund, which were used, along with the interest earned, to provide the required debt service payments.

Under Section 148(f)(4)(A), the rebate requirement does not apply to amounts in certain bona fide debt service funds. The Regulations define a bona fide debt service fund as one that is used primarily to achieve a proper matching of revenues with principal and interest payments within each bond year. The fund must be depleted at least once each bond year, except for a reasonable carryover amount not to exceed the greater of the earnings on the fund for the immediately preceding bond year or $1/12^{\text{th}}$ of the principal and interest payments on the issue for the immediately preceding bond year.

We have reviewed the Debt Service Fund and have determined that the funds deposited have functioned as bona fide debt service funds and are not subject to the rebate requirement.

6. Computation Date

May 6, 2021.

7. Computation Period

The period beginning on May 6, 2016, the date of the closing, and ending on May 6, 2021, the Computation Date.

8. Bond Year

Each one-year period (or shorter period from the date of issue) that ends at the close of business on the day in the calendar year that is selected by the Issuer. If no day is selected by the Issuer before the earlier of the final maturity date of the issue or the date that is five years after the date of issue, each bond year ends at the close of business on the anniversary date of the issuance.

9. Bond Yield

The discount rate that, when used in computing the present value of all the unconditionally payable payments of principal and interest with respect to the Bonds, produces an amount equal to the present value of the issue price of the Bonds. Present value is computed as of the date of issue of the Bonds.

10. Taxable Investment Yield

The discount rate that, when used in computing the present value of all receipts of principal and interest to be received on an investment during the Computation Period, produces an amount equal to the fair market value of the investment at the time it became a nonpurpose investment.

11. Issue Price

The price determined on the basis of the initial offering price at which price a substantial amount of the Bonds was sold.

12. Rebatable Arbitrage

The Code defines the required rebate as the excess of the amount earned on all nonpurpose investments over the amount that would have been earned if such nonpurpose investments were invested at the Bond Yield, plus any income attributable to the excess. Accordingly, the Regulations require that this amount be computed as the excess of the future value of all the nonpurpose receipts over the future value of all the nonpurpose payments. The future value is computed as of the Computation Date using the Bond Yield.

METHODOLOGY

Bond Yield

The methodology used to calculate the bond yield was to determine the discount rate that produces the present value of all payments of principal and interest through the maturity date of the Bonds.

Investment Yield and Rebate Amount

The methodology used to calculate the Rebatable Arbitrage, as of May 6, 2021, was to calculate the future value of the disbursements from all funds, subject to rebate, and the value of the remaining bond proceeds, at the yield on the Bonds, to May 6, 2021. This figure was then compared to the future value of the deposit of bond proceeds into the various investment accounts at the same yield. The difference between the future values of the two cash flows, on May 6, 2021, is the Rebatable Arbitrage.
